

WHAT IS A PROJECT? PROJECT MANAGER?



Project: - A temporary endeavor undertaken to create a unique product, service, or result



Project Manager: - Person assigned by the performing organization to lead the team responsible for achieving project objectives.





- Agile framework


ELEMENTS VETERANS BRING TO A PROJECT TEAM

WHERE DOES AGILE FIT?


- Within the construct of Military planning
 The COA development process is inherently Agile.
- Commanders don't know how they
 want to solve their problem and their
 planning team designs a series of
 potential COAs to be evaluated and
 refined until one is finally selected
- Then the deliberate planning begins



WHERE DOES AGILE FIT?

The next place Agile fits is with small unit leadership. (teams of 12 or less). Applied correctly, Agile provides a leadership framework to empower teams to solve problems, provide clarity, and rapid feedback to ever changing situations.

- I. Everyone is a team member and has equal value to contribute.
- 2. Information is shared and communicated frequently (good and bad)
- 3. No one is beyond improvement or recommendation.
- 4. Leaders remove barriers to progress and take on work that impedes the team performance
- 5. The Team matters more!!!!!



WHY GET CERTIFIED WHILE ON ACTIVE DUTY

- PMP and Agile add pieces to your leadership tool box to use when planning and conducting operations
- PMP is more applicable than military planning process into your support roles
- Civilian companies want to see post certification application
- Funding resources exist while active duty that are not there in transition (unit funding, Armyiginted)

VALUE OF CERTIFICATIONS

- Demonstrate experience, knowledge, and capability
- Easier and faster to obtain
- Helps bridge the "false perception" divide
- Teaches industry terminology and standards
- Broad application (cert dependent)
- Companies value them more than formal learning (Amazon)

HOW CAN I PAY FOR CERTIFICATION TRAINING?

- Unit Training Funds: Using the SF-182 process units can send soldiers to courses that enhance their current MOS. PMP/ACP Apply to every MOS.
 - (Limited to \$25k total purchase without a contract)
- Army Iginted: Allows all soldiers Active/Guard/Reserve to use their \$4k of TA funding towards certifications. https://www.armyignited.com/app
- AF COOL: Allows all active-duty Airmen to use up to \$4500 for certs
- Tuition reimbursement: Civilian companies
- Veteran discounts if out of pocket: all vets and family

VALUE OF PMP TO ACTIVE DUTY

- Civilian project management is the same as military planning and operations management. Project = Mission. Current military planning while standardized does not provide the granularity, detail and process standardization that civilian training does.
- Military planning processes do not account for fiscal risk, stakeholder communication strategy, change management and process control
 where PMP training does.
- PMP training enhances current military planning processes and teaches how to incorporate cost, scope, schedule and risk implication into planning.
- PMP training discusses and teaches the human engagement/leadership piece which can improve team dynamics, coordination, multi-dimensional process integration, change management, and process supervision.
- PMP teaches the industry standard terminology so Active Duty personnel can interact with civilian GS and contractor counterparts with meaningful conversations using the same language.
- PMP supports the Program Management Improvement and Accountability Act (PMIAA)
