

The Academic Outreach team is going to launch a project in January that is very exciting.


Essentially, we have been invited to participate in an opportunity to collaborate with the West Michigan Project Management Institute (WMPMI) Chapter on a project called THEProject 2025.

THEProject (<u>https://wmpmi.org/the-project-collegiate-competition</u>) is a collegiate project management competition organized by the WMPMI. Students are given a scenario, and they work as student teams to go through a PMO in 4 phases. The last phase has the teams presenting to executive judges with a chance to win a cash prize.

This year, we are going to run it with the students at Central Michigan, but we expect that we will be able to expand it to other schools in our region in the future

Historically WMPMI has focused on colleges and universities in the Western part of the state. However, the Michigan PMI chapters are working together to support the entire state, and the recruiting committee at the Western Chapter wanted to branch out further. After learning more about the program, we thought it would be a great opportunity for students in the PMIGL region.

The Academic Outreach team is participating in the kick-off meetings during the first two weeks of January and will keep you posted as the project unfolds.



PM Musings: New Year, New Ideas, and Embracing Change

As the new year begins, it's time to reflect on where we've been and where we're headed. This time of year, we pledge to change our behaviors, set goals, and reset our thinking.  - 4. **Continuous Learning**: Viewing setbacks as opportunities to learn and grow rather than as failures.
